Rules for Swift and Smart Decision Making

The following are rules to guide swift and smart decision making (Hoy & Tarter, 2010):

- 1. **Satisficing Rule**: Optimizing is impossible in school administration; learn to satisfice.
- 2. **Framing Rule:** Frame problems in positive term for positive results.
- 3. **Default Rule:** Consider doing nothing as a first option.
- 4. Simplicity Rule: Simplicity trumps complexity; start simple.
- 5. **Uncertainty Rule:** Uncertain environments often require ignoring information; trust your intuition.
- 6. Take-the Best Rule: Select and act on the first satisfactory option.
- 7. **Transparency Rule:** Make transparency a habit of thought and action.
- 8. Contingency Rule: Reflect on your successes and failures and think conditionally.
- 9. **Empowerment Rule**: Involve others in decision when you deem they have relevant knowledge, a personal stake in outcomes, and confidence that they will decide what is best for the group.
