Strong Views Loosely Held

The phrase "strong views loosely held" (M. Andreessen) is a nudge toward both firmness and openness because it suggests the possibility of changing strong views as new evidence dictates. The phrase is typically a good guide for those who embrace strong views because it suggests the possibility of a moderating effect. Strong beliefs (based on evidence), but loosely held (susceptible to change consistent with new evidence) is also a basis of a scientific temper—a perspective encompassing firmness, openness, evidence, rationality, and flexibility. The phrase is also consistent with

Malcom Gladwell's notion of Generous Orthodoxy, embracing traditions while simultaneously being open to change. Although tradition guides primary beliefs and action, openness to change is fundamental to new beliefs and behavior.
